What the Governor Said About Education in the Budget:

A Quick Look at the Numbers

Governor Shapiro presented his third budget to the General Assembly yesterday and again proposed a major investment of slightly more than a half billion new dollars in adequacy and tax equity components of state assistance to schools. The Governor told legislators convening in a joint session that "...last year, we made a commitment to not only invest a record amount of money in public education but create a brand-new formula that drives that money out to the schools that need it most. You voted for that, I signed it into law, and we agreed to keep doing it until we meet our obligation set forth in Article 3, Section 14, which guarantees every Pennsylvanian access to a 'thorough and efficient system of public education.'"

He also said, "because of our work, we've certified more new teachers than any other time in the past seven years. We identified the teacher shortage issue as a looming crisis and we did something together to address it. We created a new initiative to fund student teacher stipends to make sure those who are just getting started in this profession are paid for their hard work."

Here is a quick snapshot of major line items in the Governor's proposal for education. PARSS will be providing more detailed analysis in the coming weeks.
